Winter is Coming...

As the boating season winds down and the days become shorter and shorter it is time to think about putting the boat away for the winter. No matter whether your boat stays in the water or spends time on the hard, one of the most critical things that you can do is to properly winterize your boat. There is nothing worse than finding out that your engine froze, your water system ruptured, or that your boat is full of mold. Please remember sails as well, we do lose one head sail a season. If you do not plan to sail during the winter, take sails down and store them properly. Boat U.S. has a PDF Download for boat winterization. Electricity

Keeping your boat warm will definitely show on your electric bill. Typically a boat is not as insulated as a house, meaning a couple small heaters running will increase your electricity, sometimes significantly. The age of certain large appliances such as Hot Water Heaters can also influence your bill. The current rate as of 10/1/25 is \$0.18 per KWH for metered Electricity. Unmetered slips (flat rate), Non-liveaboards boats up to 30'- \$13.99/month; Boats 31'-36'- \$21.55/month; Boats greater than 36'- \$31.62/month. Live aboard flat rate for boats under 36' \$60.00/month and boats greater than 36' \$76.14/month.



Stays & Halyards

It is that time of year when you can hear stays and halyards hitting the sides of masts from miles away. Typically, the "clang, clang, clang" occurs when it is windy and can be quite aggravating (especially at night for our live aboards!). This is not only aggravating for our live aboards and other tenants, the rubbing and hitting on the mast can cause also damage your stays and halyards. Please be a good neighbor and secure your stays and halyards away from your mast. Using bungee cords to pull halyards away from the mast is the fastest and easiest solution. If you're not on your boat fulltime – or are leaving for a few days – try to have one or two people "keep an eye" on your boat. this will give you peace of mind especially during the windy fall/winter months.


